

Articulation Agreement
between

and
Illinois Central College

This articulation agreement is only appropriate for students who transfer from Illinois Central College to the Arts Technology Program in the College of Fine Arts at Illinois State University.

1. Illinois State University and the Arts Technology Program will accept the following courses for direct course-to-course transfer credit as defined below:





2. Illinois Central College students who wish transfer to the Arts Technology Program must first be admitted to Illinois State University.
3. Illinois Central College students must be accepted to Illinois State University will be admitted to the Arts Technology Program and will not be required to submit a portfolio for that purpose
4. Students who are accepted into the Arts Technology Program will enroll in ATK 301, Software Design I and begin work toward the completion of the Arts Technology major and a B.A./B.S. in Arts Technology at Illinois State University in the semester immediately following acceptance.
5. Students admitted to the Arts Technology Program through this transfer agreement may be required to submit a portfolio to the School of Art should they decide to transfer to a sequence within the School of Art.
6. A maximum of 70 semester hours will be accepted from Illinois Central College toward the 120 semester hours required for graduation. Students who are accepted are responsible for completing all requirements for the B.S./B.A. degree in Arts Technology. This includes all general education courses (or transferable substitutes such as the IAI General Education core), an additional Science, Mathematics or Technology course for a B.S. degree or at least three semesters of a foreign language (115 level at ISU) for a B.A. degree. A Global Studies course is required of all students regardless of degree. A more detailed description of these requirements can be found in Illinois State University undergraduate catalog.

7. Illinois State University makes this agreement in good faith and will hold places in the major for those Illinois Central College students who are accepted.
8. Any curriculum changes that affect either program must be reviewed by the other; and either school may rescind the agreement if they believe the curriculum changes do not serve the interests of their students or program.
9. This agreement shall be reviewed in 2019.
10. Illinois State University will provide Illinois Central College with regular (annual) feedback on how well ICC students are doing academically post-transfer (in the aggregate).
