

An Articulation Agreement Between  
Parkland College and Illinois State University

If a student is regularly admissible to Illinois State University and completes the Agricultural Business Management Program and all other appropriate requirements for an Associate of Applied Science Degree at Parkland College, that student shall be eligible for this Articulation Agreement

- 1 This Articulation Agreement is only appropriate to students who transfer from Parkland College with an A.A.S. degree in Agricultural Business Management and pursue a Bachelor's Degree in Agribusiness from Illinois State University
- 2 These students must complete the following course requirements at Illinois State University

- 1 Illinois State University and the School of Art will accept the following courses for direct course-to-course transfer credit as defined below



- 2 Parkland College students who wish transfer to the Graphic Design Sequence must first be admitted to Illinois State University
- 3 Parkland College students must be accepted to Illinois State University's graphic design program via a portfolio review before enrolling in art courses at Illinois State University
- 4 Parkland students who are accepted in the Graphic Design Sequence will be admitted to the School of Art and will not be required to submit a portfolio for that purpose
- 5 Parkland College students must pass ART 121, 122, 124, 128, GDS 120\*\* and/or 122\*\* prior to submitting a portfolio for review. Their portfolios will be reviewed while enrolled in GDS 120, or 122. Students must pass both GDS 120 and GDS 122 before enrolling in Illinois State University's Art 326, Graphic Design III
- 6 Portfolios must be submitted to Illinois State University's graphic design faculty. These portfolios will be included in the same review as native Illinois State University students. These reviews occur each semester. The fall review is the first Monday in October. The spring review is the first Monday in March.
- 7 Students who are accepted into the Graphic Design sequence will enroll in Art 326, Graphic Design III and begin work toward the completion of the Graphic Design Sequence and a B.A./B.S. in Art at Illinois State University in the semester immediately following the review.

- 8 Students admitted to the School of Art through this transfer agreement may be required to submit a portfolio to the School of Art should they decide to transfer to another sequence within the School of Art
- 9 A maximum of 66 semester hours (plus 4 semester hours of physical education activity courses) will be accepted from Parkland toward the 120 semester hours required for graduation. Students who are accepted are responsible for completing all requirements for the B S /B A degree in Art and the Graphic Design Sequence. This includes all general education courses (or transferable substitutes such as the IAI General Education core ), an additional Science, Mathematics or Technology course for a B S degree or at least three semesters of a foreign language (115 level at ISU) for a B A degree. A Global Studies course and the Constitution requirement are required of all students regardless of degree. A more detailed description of these requirements can be found in Illinois State University undergraduate catalog
- 10 Illinois State University makes this agreement in good faith and will hold seats for those Parkland students who are accepted and expects those students to enroll in Art 326, Graphic Design III at Illinois State University the semester immediately following the portfolio review
- 11 Any curriculum changes that affect either program must be reviewed by the other, and either school may rescind the agreement if they believe the curriculum changes do not serve the interests of their students or program
- 12 This agreement shall be reviewed in 2014

\*Course content in Parkland course GDS 122 is equivalent to Illinois State University course GDS 226 and Parkland course ART 120 is equivalent to Illinois State University course ART 227

\*\*Parkland courses GDS 120 and 122 are not sequenced. Students must submit a portfolio while enrolled in the second one taken
