## 2024-2025 Teacher Education Subsequent Endorsement Guide

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The following guide is a reference for Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) requirements for subsequent teaching endorsements. This would be applied to any candidate who is either of the following:

1. Going through a fully approved teacher education program and looking to add a subsequent endorsement area outside their main program (This is currently enrolled students in a teacher education program looking for a second endorsement area).
  - Subsequent endorsements can be earned simultaneously to completion of full program major.
  - Example- A currently enrolled elementary education major taking subsequent endorsement coursework for reading in hopes of graduating with both the elementary and reading teacher endorsement.
2. Already licensed for a Professional Educator License (PEL) and looking to add a subsequent endorsement area outside their already granted area by taking coursework at ISU (This is licensed teachers looking to take additional courses to expand endorsement areas).
  - Must have an issued PEL within your ELIS account
  - All coursework would need to be taken at ISU and/or previously transferred into ISU
  - Example- A secondary licensed (Grades 9-12) Math teacher wanting to complete summer coursework to help them add a subsequent endorsement in middle level (Grades 5-8) math.

IMPORTANT: Please know that all subsequent endorsements are determined by the Illinois State Board of Education and are based on licensure rules and interpretation of code. Endorsement requirements can change based on updated code. Flexibility in subsequent endorsements and availability outside of initial PEL grade range is due to code changes in fall 2019.

The following endorsements can be added to any PEL if credit hours (most are 18), coursework (some endorsements have specific types of coursework), and/or content test requirements are met. It's advised to review the ISBE acceptable areas of coursework for the endorsement area (see link above).

**Please know that there is no guarantee that 18 hours in a subsequent endorsement subject area can prepare candidates for successful passage of the required endorsement content test. To increase success on the content test, students should review the following items to assist in choosing subsequent endorsement coursework.**

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## **Frequently Asked Questions**

### **Question: How do I apply for a subsequent endorsement?**

*Answer: When you apply for graduation during your student teaching semester you will be asked what endorsements you anticipate completing. The Registrars office will then evaluate your coursework and testing against the requirements for these endorsements. If you meet the requirements, their office will entitle you for licensure within your ELIS account so you can apply and be granted the endorsement areas. After your initial licensure and graduation, you can apply for subsequent endorsements in two manners (Note- you can only go through one of the following processes).*

1. *First, if you took all courses at ISU or had them previously transferred into ISU, you can be evaluated by the Registrar's office. Please go to the following site to review rules and start the process: <https://registrar.illinoisstate.edu/educator-licensure/subsequent-endorsements/>*
2. *Second, if after reviewing the rules via #1 above, if you do not qualify, you can apply directly to the Illinois State Board of Education via your ELIS account. This will start a transcript evaluation and you will have to send all transcripts to ISBE for this evaluation. (Note- If you apply directly through ISBE, this blocks ISU from reviewing/updating your ELIS records, so review the process via #1 above before applying to ISBE.)*

### **Question: How do I choose what courses to take?**

*Answer: ISU has large number of courses that can fit into each content endorsement area. It's advised to look at the ISBE acceptable areas of coursework and if there are any specific require courses. If the ISU courses fit the acceptable areas and required courses, it will be counted towards the endorsement area. ### **Question: How do I prepare for the licensure Exam?**

*Answer: Review all testing materials available. These include testing framework (What's covered on the exam), study guides, flashcards, and other materials. Use the following link for resources: <https://teachercenter.illinoisstate.edu/students/gateways/content/>*

### **Question: Can I use transfer courses?**

*Answer: Yes, but the courses must articulate to an ISU course. If they do not articulate to an ISU course, it may not be counted towards the acceptable areas of coursework and 18 hours needed for ISU to entitle the endorsement. For cases in which a transfer course can't be articulated, it's advised the candidate should apply directly to ISBE for the subsequent endorsement after the initial professional education license is acquired.*

### **Question: Can I take courses after I graduate to finish a subsequent endorsement?**

*Answer: Yes. Coursework can be taken at ISU or at another institution. If all coursework of the subsequent endorsement is taken at ISU, you can be reviewed for the subsequent endorsement through the Registrar's office at the following link: <https://registrar.illinoisstate.edu/educator-licensure/subsequent-endorsements/> If coursework was taken at a separate institution, post ISU graduation, you should apply directly to ISBE and undergo a transcripts evaluation.*

### **Question: Who do I talk to if I have questions?**

*Answer: First, start with your advisor with any endorsement questions and the advisor of the department you are working towards the subsequent endorsement. **Question: Can I use work experience towards meeting bilingual or ESL requirement of 100 clinical hours?**

Answer: Yes. If you have 3 months' work experience or more in this setting the Registrar's office will need a letter from your employer stating the timeline of your work experience and how it specifically related to bilingual or ESL setting.
